# Outlook

News from Blandford Forum and Langton Long - January 2007

## "Never too old/young to learn !"

The process of change in the world means that there will always be new things to learn and new technology for us to come to terms with. A mere ten years ago, the Internet and e-mail were a novelty and mobile phones still seemed to be the size of a small brick - and look at them now ! For previous generations, the need to learn new things as adults was not so great a problem because new things came along so infrequently, people had the time to study and absorb them - nowadays, new things come along so fast that we barely have time to understand them before something else comes along which is even better or bigger or faster. The temptation is for us to find places where things don't change and where we can feel comfortable



and secure with established things ... like the Church, for example! Perhaps not! People sometimes confuse the things the Church *teaches* with the way they are *expressed* - they are tempted to think that the only way the timeless truths of the Gospel can be expressed is in timeless forms of worship.

### Our Parishes' Verse for 2007

*"Teach me your way, O LORD,  
and I will walk in your truth;  
give me an undivided heart,  
that I may fear your name.  
I will praise you, O Lord my God,  
with all my heart;  
I will glorify your name forever."*  
*Psalm 86:11-12*

Some of the old liturgies are beautiful and have a timeless quality about them, but the Church has to keep moving forward otherwise it will stagnate and die. Our verse for 2007 talks of moving - of walking in God's ways and being guided into them - like the mountain stream which carves its way through a valley to bring refreshment and life. This year promises to be an exciting time involving a weekend away and a move to two morning services at BFPC: two ways in which I believe that God can teach us to walk in his truth with undivided hearts.

It is tempting to want to stay where we are and say I am too young/ old to learn! Or we can follow where God takes us and be taught by him so that we can grow and develop as a Church and as individuals. My prayer is that 2007 will be such a time of learning and growth for all of us.

## "Music in Worship" Workshop Day

What an incredible day it was!



It started with twelve of us from Blandford Parish Church making our way over to Shaftesbury School for the event on a Saturday morning. On entering the school we were greeted by no less than a Bishop, Bishop Tim! Wow! - this was going to be some day if this was just the start of it. We were all given a good cup of tea to settle us before the days events began.

This started with an introduction to the songs that we would be singing at the end of the day service. This all helped us to relax and start to appreciate what the day was about to hold for all of us, we were then guided to the various sub-groups that were scattered throughout the school. My group, 'Enabling Congregational Song' remained in the main hall. This was masterfully run by someone whose voice was the voice of an angel and who took us so effortlessly through song after song, teaching us to relax and to move with the rhythm of the music. We were treated, and it was truly a treat, with learning songs from the length and breadth of our Isle and we even learned songs from the Congo, and South Africa -we even sang in Swahili! ## What's so special about February 4th 2007 ?

### New Service Plans

Sunday February 4th is the day when our new plan of services begins (mainly affecting BFPC but with one change at Langton). So what does it mean ... ?

#### 9.00am - A "Formal" Service

What this means ... a service from either the Book of Common Prayer or Common Worship which is usually a Communion Service and robes will normally be worn. There will usually be traditional hymns sung.

#### 9.45/10.00am - Coffee for Everyone

After the 9am service, everyone is invited for coffee - those who have just attended the 9am service as well as those arriving for the 10.30am service.

#### 10.20am - Children Leave for Groups

Leaders of J Team will be on hand at coffee to take the children on to their groups.

#### 10.30am - An "Informal" Service

What this means .... ! Led by a worship group, this will be a service which is similar in style to the informal Communion services which have been held on the 4th Sundays in the recent past. Using mainly modern songs and hymns, beginning with a time of sung worship, a sermon, prayer - and everything on the big screen. Once a month, there will be an All Age Service and a Holy Communion service.
