Genesis 1:2+3

Now the earth was formless and empty, darkness was over the surface of the deep, and the Spirit of God was hovering over the waters.

And God said, "Let there be light," and there was light.

A Messy Church

Every time I see the news stories about tornadoes in the Midwest States of America, I am in awe of the power and the consequences of that power: the devastated homes and buildings, the shattered lives and the communities which have literally been reduced to matchsticks. The book of Genesis begins with the simplest of ideas - that in the act of Creation, on a universal scale, God did exactly the opposite and brought order out of total chaos, taking devastation and making something amazing out of it, something with order and purpose, something beautiful, something which spoke of his awesome power and majesty. The picture we get is of the Holy Spirit, hovering over this chaos, desperate to make something recognisable and good out of it. Whether it was the "Big Bang" or however God chose to do it, the image is of a Creator God who wanted to make sense of this chaos and do something with it.

I find this an immensely powerful and encouraging image and have many times, in the minutes before a service or some other event, found myself praying, Holy Spirit, come and make order out of this chaos. I seek it in my life, with the prayer that the Holy Spirit will transform the chaos of my diary into an ordered and planned means by which God can build his Kingdom in this place. It is amazing how God does it, with a peace and calm that is in such contrast with the raw materials he works with!

But it is important, too, that we recognise the reality of this idea in our work - that those we seek to reach as part of our Vision to see every road Baptised in the Love of God often show the effects of the tornadoes in their lives: relationships, work and money, addictions and many other areas which have spiralled out of control.



On July 11th, our 10.30am service will be in the Centre and will introduce the idea of "Messy Church" to many people. Messy Church is aimed at the inclusion of the youngest in our community and aims to offer a style of worship that is simple and is based around activities that inevitably involve getting messy! It is our plan to introduce this as a midweek event on a monthly basis, beginning in the autumn. The team, led by Rosy, are planning to run this in the Centre as a way of introducing those at our Rainbows Toddler Group, and others in the community, to the wonderful news of Jesus which we want to share with them. So come on 11th July, and simply enjoy Messy Church!

The Gospels are littered with messy incidents - it is in the pigsty that the Prodigal Son realises that his life is broken, it is in the administrative mess of the Wedding at Cana, that Jesus steps in and brings order and purpose. And, ultimately, it is in the horror and mess of the Cross that Jesus brings us the opportunity for new life. We look at chaos and are tempted to panic - God looks at it and says to the Spirit "Transform it" and he does!

NOTES FROM THE GARDEN

It's now well into summer, the Centre has been open for four months and the garden is taking shape. Here's an update.

We need YOU & PLANTS!

- o The contract for getting the garden framework in place was awarded to Quality Landscapes. They started working in early May and completed the groundworks just 7 days later! A good job done.
- o The works included preparing the ground for the laying of the lawn & the woodchip area, lining out the main beds, including a small raised bed and planting five climbers onto trellis screens.
- o Volunteers have got the lawn established by watering it during a really dry period through June (typical!) and mowing it. *A really big thank you to these folk!* The trees are now fully in leaf, and the birds have already started visiting - the garden bird list already stands at some five species. And the compost bin is filling up! The children will be making bird boxes at an event in September.
- o We need shrubs and perennials to fill the two beds along the fence. If you are digging up plants from your garden that could be suitable, put them on one side & bring them to the Centre for the 10th July
- o The next date for your diaries is **Saturday 10th July from 10 am**. This is the morning when we will plant up the main beds - any donated plants must be at the Centre by this time. Anyone is very welcome to help lay out the plants and then plant them. Coffee and tea provided (of course).
- o The garden plan also allows for 3 benches. If you would like to donate a bench, perhaps in memory of someone, please speak to a member of the Steering group. All benches will need to be made of timber from a sustainable source.
- o We need several GARDEN CHAMPIONS to maintain the garden. Contact the office on 456260 or at office@bfpc.com for a chat. The main job is mowing the lawn - the rest of the garden has been designed to be low maintenance; the raised bed could be used as a small allotment by the 'gardeners' - is this an incentive???

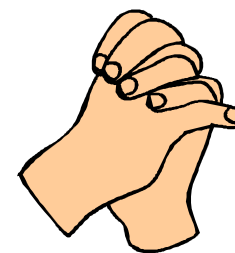
